- 4 Pillars

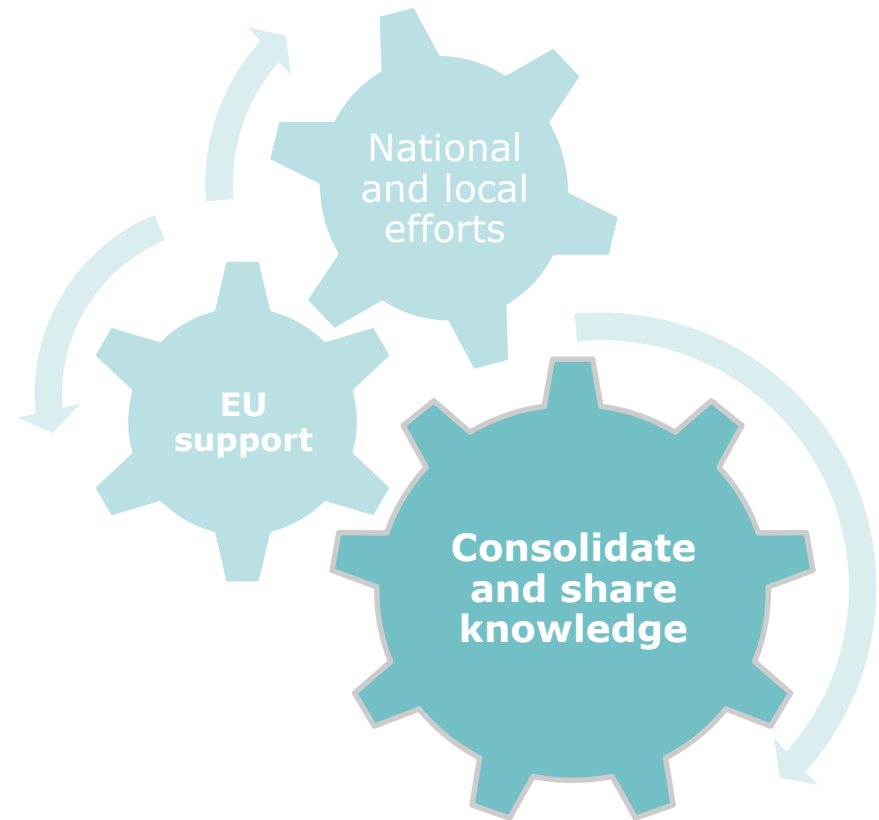
Actions to be taken at local, national, EU and international level across 4 pillars
